calming natural fragrances to Japanese soaps and French beard brushes, here are some local essentials to stock your cabinets and countertops.

Strike the match and slip into the tub after a long day, and let a trio of natural fragrances—cypress, eucalyptus, and vetiver—whisk you into the ether. This eight-ounce candle lasts and lasts, but when the wax has finally waned, repurpose its simple jar as a windowsill planter or elegant countertop storage container. [See more candles.](#)

A great zero-emission alternative to scented candles, this stylish porcelain oil lamp freshens up large bathrooms and living areas with whatever scent you choose to use.

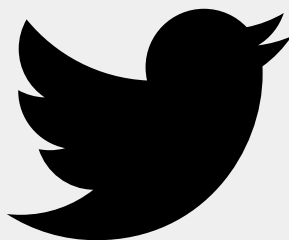
