Local talent takes center stage for a more genuine cultural experience. Whether enjoying Puerto Rican-inspired music and showing off your reggaeton moves at the Miami Beach Bandshell or catching the Jonas Brothers at nearby Kaseya Center, getting great seats and dance-floor spots is easier this time of year.

Fall 2023 brings the Ocean Drive Music Promenade Series, a musical walkabout with artists like Puerto Rican singer/songwriter Pedro Capó: La Neta Tour, the Latin Hip-Hop of Mala Rodriguez, and the wild rhythm-and-blues of Seattle's The Dip. Early October boasts Miami Beach's Billboard Latin Music Week (Oct 2 – Fri, Oct 6). Along with Jonas Brothers (Oct 14), Kaseya Center hosts Depeche Mode (Oct 12). There's also South Beach's Nossa Omakase for Portuguese tuna and caviar and downtown's Gekko for Japanese

olive-fed wagyu steak. Sound tasty? It's low season, but these are hotspots, so sleep in your Roami, not on those reservations!

### **Oktoberfest and Brewery Hopping in Fort Lauderdale**
